3. T. Bolanderi, Greene. T. angustifolia, var. (?) Bolanderi, Wats. Bot. Calif. i. 208 (1876). Stems stoutish, simple, 2-5 in. long, the lower portion with long internodes and rooting at the nodes; leaves linear or linear-oblong, acutish, subterete, slightly connate: fl. short-pedicellate, the pedicel in fruit elongated and surpassing the leaves: petals oblong, acutish, equalling the carpels, more than twice the length of the ovate calyx-segments.—In characters of flower and fruit much like the

preceding, but widely different in all other particulars. Frequent on muddy shores about San Francisco. May.
